**TEACHING & WORK HISTORY**

Lecturer Professor-California Institute of Integral Studies: August 2006-to Present. Adjunct Lead Faculty in the Interdisciplinary Studies Department. I am currently teaching Abnormal Psychology. In previous semesters, I have taught History and Systems of Psychology, Global Studies, Personal Responsibility and Social Change, Integrative Project, Culture and Community, Knowledge and Inquiry, and Research Writing.
